No objections were raised by the Parish Council.

20/10/102 To consider and review actions resulting from annual playground inspection report(s)

The Lancaster City Council annual inspection occurred on 20th August. Most items were rated at Low Risk or Very Low Risk apart from:

- Various issues relating to the boardwalk, mainly relating to rotting timbers, but also protruding screws/bolts. Repairs to the worst section have been started but there is a substantial amount of work involved.
- The final part of the report for St Wilfrid's Park was received on 13th October. This highlighted issues associated with the group swings and wooden climbing frame which will need remedial work where possible.

The PlayDale annual inspection occurred on the 4th September. All items were rated at Low Risk or Very Low Risk, though there are various recommendations that will need to be followed-up, such as:

- Lifting and refitting grass mats that have sunk down too far and removal of fixing pins that are no longer required
- Removing or covering bolt protrusions
- Repainting and protecting some metalwork that is rusting
- Repairing woodwork that is rotting, e.g. benches
- Covering holes that risk finger entrapment

It was resolved: Swing brackets at St Wilfrid's to be checked and if necessary to source some galvanised half-moon brackets to strengthen the hangers.

20/10/103 To consider taking out a Public Works loan to provide funds to improving sports and play facilities

Cllr Jefferson reported on initial plans for improving the recreational area including part of the woodland. This would be dependent upon the Section 106 money from the Story Homes development.

It was resolved: Consideration of Recreational Area improvements, play equipment and S106 money to be added to the next agenda.

It was resolved: Clerk to calculate how much can be borrowed without increasing the precept.

20/10/104 To consider changes to the Trustees of the Halton War Memorial Institute

A new set of trustees are needed, but there may be more to report next month.

20/10/105 To consider process for appointing replacement grounds staff

There was brief discussion on the need for a third grounds person who will be sought next year.
