

BROADBAND FOR THE RURAL NORTH – B4RN

In my last update we were expecting to be able to make the main cabinet near the skate park live with a link from Wen-

ning House under the road across the Story Homes site. Unfortunately Story Homes would charge a significant sum for this, and could not provide a date for the work. An alternative route from a chamber at the junction of Schoolhouse Lane and Low Road along the grass on the south side of Low Road was considered over two years ago. Unfortunately, not all residents were willing to give permission to cross their section of the grass. their site to go round the east and south sides of the Forgewood estate, returning to the Low Road via an Openreach duct. We expect digging will start towards the end of March and we anticipate the cabinet will be live by the end of April. This route will necessarily involve extra expense and disruption (road crossings and digging up pavements) when compared to the more direct routes.

Multicore fibres have been blown from the cabinet to the chamber near HiQ garage, and from there to the two chambers in the school field. Four volunteers have attended a course on installing house kits. Installing the kits has begun and is planned to be complete by the time the cabinet becomes live. Optical fibres can then be blown from the chambers to around 30 properties, including the school.

We now have a crossing under Beech Road linking ducts installed in the school field to a chamber in the garden of Lunesdale Community (previously Abbeyfield). This will allow us to establish routes to the north west of Halton.

A plan is being prepared to supply Mill Lane properties using Openreach ducts. Reaching the rest of Halton will depend on the level of volunteer support, not just digging, but handling the ducts, coordinating the local area, providing refreshments and generally encouraging. We meet on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30pm at The Centre and welcome interest from other parts of the village.



NEWS FROM THE HEARTS OF HALTON W.I.

THROUGH THE LENS OF THE WI

There was a buzz of anticipation, greetings had been made, this month's raffle tickets bought and the competition table themed 'a picture of Lancaster' boasted a range of photos, drawings and ancient articles. The lights were low, the room became hushed and a familiar figure appeared on the bright screen in front of us. We listened as a story of flirtation, jealousy, social and racial boundaries being explored, fear and intrigue, murder, mutilation and the death penalty unfolded. Buck Ruxton, born in India, was presented as a muchloved family doctor, establishing himself in the heart of Lancaster in the centre of Dalton Square. Most of us knew the story: how he had married in India, left his wife, travelled to England, met and set up home with an English woman separated from her Dutch husband, claiming her as his wife. They had two daughters and a son, and to the hardworking mill workers of Lancaster, he was heralded as the people's friend, often treating patients whether or not they could afford the fees.

Who could have guessed that behind this mild-mannered family GP there was a heart beset with jealousy and fear of losing his 'wife's' interest? Who could have foreseen the murder and mutilation of his maid servant and 'wife', wrapping body parts in a variety of materials, including the souvenir edition of the Sunday Graphic, printed and circulated only in the Lancaster and Morecambe area, and depositing the parts over a bridge in Scotland, into a stream below, providing critical evidence in the case? Dr Buck Ruxton left a trail. This was the first case solved completely on forensic evidence which, given the time period, was police work way ahead of its time, leading to the hanging of Ruxton. We were spellbound as our speaker showed us photographs of the Ruxton children and told us

There may be a few teething problems to start with, but assuming everything goes to plan, you will soon be able to fill your bookings forms on-line or on your phone and pay by card or BACS. You will still be

able to have hard copies if you prefer and pay by cash or cheque.

As the bookings officer who taught herself computer work, I am in awe of Naomi and more than a bit scared of working with this new system but I'm sure that once I get the hang of it, if I get the hang of it, it will be fantastic and save so much time for everyone.

BUILDING WORK: The refurbishment of the old Toilet Block will be carried out during the 6 week summer break as this is our quietest time. The work includes fitting a 'changing places' toilet & wet room for people with multiple disabilities, an adult & child size toilet and storage for the village's emergency plan equipment. We will not be taking any extra bookings for the main hall from July 19 to end August, to limit disruption for the refurbishment process.

Apart from the Main Hall we expect the rest of the building to function normally during the refurbishment. The cost of this project has been estimated at £45,000. So far the HCA (Halton Community Association) Committee have raised £3,920 through volunteering for our bar and organising fundraising events. We have been awarded £10,000 from 'Awards For All' and £5,000 from 'Halton Lune Trust' (Hydro). More grants have been applied for but there is never a guarantee of success.

As I write £25,000 is still to be found, so we are requesting help from the village. Please offer your help organising fundraising events, or perhaps a personal donation, however small, would be gratefully received.

The running of The Centre and events would not be possible if it wasn't for the support of volunteers, many of whom go unseen but are very much appreciated. Anyone who would like to volunteer some time will always be welcomed and allocated an agreed suitable task.







PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

DOG FOULING ON THE FOOTBALL • PITCH

There continues to be a persistent problem of dogs fouling the football pitch, • despite several bins in the vicinity and signage. Children and adults regularly play on the pitch and it is both disgusting • and also a potential health hazard.

The Parish Council and The Centre will monitor the situation, but it may be necessary to consider banning dogs from the pitch altogether, as has happened at Caton recently.

EMERGENCY PLAN VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

A small team of volunteers drafted an Emergency Plan for the village after the floods in 2015 and 2017. This plan identifies what should happen in the event of an emergency, such as flooding, but it lacks the "who". To ensure the village has a plan that can be implemented, it needs a range of people who would be willing to help in the event of an emergency. For instance:

- "I could help the team drafting the emergency plan"
- "I would be willing to check on the vulnerable people on my street"
- "I would be willing to make teas/coffees in The Centre in the event that it opens as a temporary refuge"
- "I have a vehicle that could tow vehicles or trailers if needed"
- "I would be willing to co-ordinate a small team of people via walkie-talkies"

- "I would be willing to keep an eye on the flooding/drains on my street and let others know if there is an issue"
- "I have a 4x4 and could transport some signs/equipment from the store to where they are needed"
- "I could help start the emergency generator at The Centre if there is a loss of power"
- "I could help drivers/divert traffic if a road becomes impassable"

If you think you could assist, then please contact the Clerk who will pass your details on to the Emergency Response plan team.
