

#### REVERENT REFLECTIONS

#### CHRISTMAS CANCELLED?



Recent postings on Facebook have compared Boris Johnson to Oliver Cromwell saying that they have both effectively abolished Christmas. Before Cromwell came to power, Christmas was one of the most important dates in the calendar, both as a religious festival and as an important holiday period. During the twelve days of Christmas, churches and other buildings were decorated and church services were widely attended. Gifts were exchanged at New Year, and Christmas boxes were distributed to servants, tradesmen and the poor. Food was consumed in large amounts, and the rich and poor alike indulged in dancing, singing, games and plays. Then in 1644 it was all stopped because Christmas was banned!

Christmas then, as now, was a time of both long-cherished rituals and excessive social behaviour. From the mid 1500s, objections to supposedly frivolous additions to the religious calendar, like Christmas, were voiced by Puritan leaders. They saw Christmas as a waste-

ful festival that threatened Christian beliefs and encouraged immoral activities, to the 'great dishonour of God'. The discontent felt within the Puritan community towards festivals led to the enactment of forceful legislation. In January 1645, Parliament produced a new Directory for Public Worship that made clear that festival days, including Christmas, were not to be celebrated but spent in respectful contemplation.

At the time of writing this, we are experiencing a second lockdown and we have little idea of what restrictions will still be in place by Christmas. One thing is certain, Christmas will be very different this vear. However, despite everything, Christmas is NOT cancelled! We can still celebrate the birth of the Christ child. God Incarnate, and hear again the message of love, joy and peace that the birth of Jesus brings to us all. Jesus was God incarnate, in that He was God in the flesh and came to live among us. This means that Jesus knew what it means to suffer and experienced all the emotions

that we do and understands the struggles that we are all going through at this difficult and challenging time.

I have been amazed at the imagination and flexibility that people have shown to find new ways of doing things since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic. I am sure that this will also be so for finding innovative and memorable ways of celebrating Christmas this year. Yes, there will be sadness if we can't have large gatherings of family and friends. This year we will probably have to celebrate in more personal and intimate ways, but this doesn't mean that we can't still have fun! It may also be that as we celebrate in new ways we may also think more about what Christmas is really about.

# NEWS FROM HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Firstly, a very big thank you to all who came to our Outdoor Plant Sale on September 19th and visited our plant stalls. We would also like to thank those who gave us generous donations as well as extra plants and produce to sell. Finally, a special thank you to Maureen Richardson and the Centre staff who helped and advised us with our last minute decision to hold Garden Gate Plant Sales in addition to our gazebo stall on the football field.

Our members enjoyed meeting gardeners of all ages with very varying gardening experience and we hope that the plants purchased have settled into their new locations. We were extremely fortunate with the weather and as our visitors walked round

the village, some remarked that the sunny afternoon held for them happy memories of the last Garden Safari when members' gardens were open for all to enjoy. After such an enjoyable afternoon we are pleased to report that £685.72 was received for HGG funds.

Some of this money will be used towards the upkeep of HGG garden areas but the main proportion has been set aside to start a fund for major improvements in the Memorial Garden. For several years this pleasant but challenging public space has been loyally tended by one of our members but is now in need of renovation. With the agreement of the Parish Council, the Memorial Garden has become our main focus for this year and next, and a new subgroup has been formed to make plans for this exciting new project for our village. At the moment planning is in the very early stages but we will publish updates as this develops.

Many of you often stop and talk to us as we work on our gardens around the village. We have been encouraged by your positive comments and we particularly appreciated the letter of thanks from Marion in an earlier Prattle edition. Our planting areas all have the approval of the Parish Council and are tended by a small band of HGG gardeners who seek to improve our village green spaces, thereby sharing the pleasures and benefits of gardens and gardening with the wider community. Over the last few years we have adopted several new areas and evidence of HGG activities can now be seen throughout the village. At the lower end of Halton we take care of the Burial Ground, the Memorial Garden and the bus stop planter. Another three

areas are to be found at the other end of the village: the top bus stop planter, the Village Stores planter and the double sided stone planter at the Low Road Halton sign. The central ginnel, linking the High Road to the Low Road, contains a further two little gardens: the raised wooden bed at the top of the ginnel and the two sides of the Lythe Fell entrance half way down the ginnel path. At the Centre we have a further four areas: the recently constructed Terrace Garden to the left of the main entrance, two grey planters in front of the main building, two wooden raised beds in the children's area and the Wildflower Bank facing the football field.

Most of the gardens and planters have been funded through HGG plant sales, along with generous grants from Halton Lune Trust and Carnforth Rotary. In addition, we have received seeds from Grow Wild, the national outreach initiative of the Royal Botanical Gardens, Kew, to help reestablish the Wildflower Bank. The wooden raised beds at the Centre were constructed by Centre staff who also help with the annual strim on the Wildflower Bank. and the double stone planter on the Low Road was built for us by Wrenman Homes. This year we purchased our spring bulbs from a wholesaler and a subgroup was formed to choose a selection that would complement all our areas. As well as economising on expense and time, this had the added benefit of an enjoyable meeting in a member's garden in beautiful late summer sunshine.

Over the winter months HGG members will be busy completing the bulb planting, discussing ideas for the Memorial Garden and making plans for a Spring Sale in 2021, hopefully in late May. Details of this event will be published as soon as possible and

we look forward to another afternoon of sharing plants and garden ideas with fellow enthusiasts.

HGG meetings are on the third Tuesday of the month at 9:30 a.m. and have taken place at the Centre and by Zoom. In most years meetings have stopped in December and January but, with a major new project to discuss and in the absence of our normal Christmas social gathering, we will be meeting throughout the year. in February and no turbine running during the long summer dry spell, with rocky outcrop sunbathing and swimming, as well as walkers taking advantage of the numerous countryside footpaths.

Autumn has introduced the usual blocking of turbine inlet screens by leaves, compensated by amazing riverside views, and whilst revenue is down compared to a very smooth 2019, we had no real complaints until heavy prolonged rain brought a tidal wave of water from the various catchments overnight early November and more boulders into the hydro inlet. This will require a second drain down of the year with outside working and Covid precautions, so definitely a complaint against the law of probability.

As mentioned in July, it is the expertise, enthusiasm and good sense of humour of the Hydro team that keep it all ticking over, with results of producing "green" electrici-

ty, in addition to funds going to the Halton Lune Trust at the end of December each year for worthy community causes.



# LOW ROAD, HALTON

On Sunday 30th August, a neighbour and I decided to treat ourselves to an outing along Low Road, Halton, in the direction of Crook of Lune. The weather was pleasant and we were looking forward to our trip. My neighbour is a recently arrived and enthusiastic resident who has been particularly impressed with, and enjoyed walking along the pavement footpaths running out of the village - until Sunday when she accompanied me with the scooter.

#### WHO DOES THE WORK?

Getting the connection from the Toby Box is done in one of 4 ways:

- 1. DIY: you do this yourself
- 2. Street group: you and your neighbours all help each other (essentially still DIY).
- 3. Private contractor/handyman: at your cost.
- 4. Village volunteer group: This is not available to the majority of the village, just because of the size of the workforce. The volunteer group will assist those incapable of options 1-3 in the first instance. We don't predict we will have much free capacity beyond that. However, people will be available to advise and bounce any questions off should you need to. You will not be alone!

#### DIG GRANT FROM B4RN

For options 1 – 4 above, B4RN has a £150 dig grant that can be claimed retro-



spectively by the householder, after you connect to the live service. Payment is for providing the labour to make the final part of the connection. It is payment for your time, or to reimburse you for any cost in hiring someone to do the work for you (option 3).

You can claim the £150 dig grant if you complete the work independently of the village volunteer team (options 1 or 2). Should the village team be used to meet any of the work, the £150 will go to the village pot and will be used to fund a community project. Some households who have completed the work independently have chosen to donate their £150 to the village community project fund regardless. However, this is at the discretion of each individual. It is worth noting All network specific materials are provid- that the grant is not an immediate payment, and can take a month or so to come through from B4RN.

#### STREET REPS

Street Reps are an essential role in the process, and if you don't have one (or more) in your area, you will need to find one. The Street Reps job is to pass on the information between residents and B4RN and get as many people as possible ready at the same time.

Once you have connected the 7mm ducting, and house kit from your property to the Toby Box, you are ready for the fibre. The fibre is blown, by B4RN, down the ducting on a cushion of air. For efficiency, the blowing team needs to attend as many properties as possible on the same visit. Therefore, it is streets that have

# BREAST SCREENING SAVES LIVES – DON'T MISS YOUR APPOINTMENT

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in the UK, with one in seven women being diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime. The risk of developing breast cancer increases with age, which is why all women between the ages of 50 and 70 are invited for screening every three years.

Bay Health and Care Partners would like to urge everyone who is invited for breast screening to please attend their appointment and to reassure everyone that it is safe to do so. Dr Karen Oliver, Lancaster GP and GP Cancer Lead at Morecambe Bay Clinical Commissioning Group said: "I would like to remind women of the importance of attending your breast screening appointment, now that the service is up and running again, as a service has been developed to comply with COVID-19 regulations. GPs have been seeing patients with worrying symptoms and referring them on the cancer pathway throughout lockdown and will continue to do so. If you are experiencing symptoms, such as a new breast lump or breast pain please contact your GP Surgery."

To ensure your safety, all clinicians will be using Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) which includes plastic aprons, face masks and plastic gloves. Rooms and machines are cleaned down between each patient and waiting rooms have been restructured to make sure a two-metre distance can be kept at all times.

Breast screening aims to find breast cancers early. In the meantime, if you are worried about breast cancer symptoms such as a lump or an area of thickened tissue in the breast, or you notice that your breasts look or feel different, do not wait to be offered a screening appointment, talk to your GP straight away. Dr Oliver added: "The earlier breast cancer is diagnosed, the better the chance of successful treatment, so it's important to check your breasts regularly and contact your GP if you notice any changes."




