MINISTER'S THOUGHT

BUILD BACK BETTER

Our lives are often described as a journey and sometimes, as in the year 2020, we end up in unexpected places. This time last year none of us could have predicted what was to come and that our lives would be turned upside down by the Coronavirus pandemic. When we find ourselves in these unexpected situations, although they may be uncomfortable, and even painful, we are changed by our experiences and will often learn from them.

Over the last month churches have been marking the season of Epiphany when we remember the journey of the Magi, or 'wise men'. They decided to leave their homes to follow a star to find a child, who had been born king of the Jews. Their journey would have been long and hard. They go to Herod's palace, the obvious place to find a new king, but instead they find Jesus in an unexpected place, an ordinary humble home in Bethlehem. Here they are able to give their gifts to the child Jesus and they are greatly blessed, being 'overwhelmed with joy'. They are changed by their encounter and, having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they go home by a different route.

There are important lessons we can learn from this story which we can reflect on as we look back over 2020 and look forward to the future:

1 - The wise men didn't travel alone. The wise men would have supported each other, encouraging each other when the journey got tough. During 2020 we saw many examples of people supporting and encouraging others through things like the weekly 'clap for the NHS'. We all know the importance of having people around us when we are struggling and going through difficult times, and each one of us can continue to try and offer help to others. Sometimes something as simple as making a phone call to someone who we think may be feeling lonely, can make a world of difference to them.

2 - The wise men's journey was one of faith which led to a great reward. Although the wise men were guided by a star, their journey was very much a journey of faith. They didn't know how long their journey would last or where their final destination would be. Their journey was bold and courageous; it was one of searching and questioning, of pain and joy, of fear and hope. Our journey through 2020 has been very similar, and as we go forward into 2021 there is still much uncertainty and anxiety, but we can now start to look forward with hope to a better future due to the development of the new vaccines.

3 - The wise men were changed by their experiences. The wise men are warned in a dream not to return to Herod, so they went home by a different route. We don't know what happened to the wise men after they returned home, but we do know that they were changed by their

experience of meeting with Jesus. As we go forward into 2021, our experiences during 2020 have taught us much. We have become much more aware of the importance of our families and friends and of the value of our key workers. There are many things which we took for granted in the past which I expect we will really appreciate in the future, such as the freedom to travel and to take part in social activities. We saw positive effects on our environment as more of us worked from home. We have also become more aware of those in need in our local communities and put in place our village collections for the Morecambe Food bank.

There is much talk of looking forward to returning to 'normal'. However, in the rush to return to 'normal' we must take time to consider which parts of normal are worth rushing back to. We all need to journey on together, encouraging one another, and looking forward with hope. We can ask God to help us to learn from our experiences during 2020 and to have the strength to act upon what we have learnt to build a better future.

HALTON GARDENING GROUP

As spring approaches small shoots are appearing in the tubs, planters, terrace and grounds tended by this active group. It heralds the start of new life and hope, promising a glorious display of narcissi, muscari, tulips and other spring flowers in the early months of 2021.

The group are going to be very busy in 2021/22 refurbishing the Memorial Garden on the corner of Church Brow and Foundry Lane, with support from the Parish Council, contractors and any other willing volunteers. Over £2000 has already been raised from grants and last year's plant sale to help with the restoration. Further fundraising applications are being made alongside plans for our next Plant Sale on Saturday May 22nd 2021. This ambitious project has captured the imagination of our members and supporters; however, there is a great deal of work to do and any additional help will

be greatly appreciated. Obviously, the COVID-19 lockdown restrictions will impact our ability to progress as quickly as we would have liked, but some work can be commenced with the help of contractors.

We are hoping to remove and reduce overgrown and overhanging shrubs in the three border beds and replant with a more suitable selection of plants and flowers, which reflect the era during which the garden was built and are sensitive to its purpose as a Memorial space. Working with the existing large cherry tree and some remaining shrubs, the new planting will provide year round interest and colour, with respect for wildlife. As funds grow we intend to provide more seating and a structural central focal point with plants. We expect it will take us until summer 2022 to complete.



COPING IN LOCKDOWN!

OUR HOBBY HAS KEPT US SANE DURING THE PANDEMIC

We are modern square dancers, totally hooked on our hobby, which enables us to socialise, meet new people and, of course, dance. Square dancing has no footwork so appeals to those with two left feet. Although danced in couples in a square of 8, you do not need a partner to attend. There is a huge variety of music played and although, like anything new, it takes some time to learn, even total beginners will be enjoying dancing on the first night. Think of a Ceilidh but done in squares. That's the first night. Each week you learn a little more, then the fun really takes off.

It is a world-wide hobby, called in English wherever you are. For some reason it is not as widely known as Line Dancing or Sequence Dancing. It is particularly good for the brain and it's not repetitive like almost all other forms of dance.

We, personally, normally danced 4 times a week, pre-pandemic, and travelled around the country or abroad about 10 times a year for weekend events.

Of course the pandemic squashed all that when everything closed. **BUT** Square dancers are a resilient lot. We discovered Zoom. Gradually, since last March Square dance callers from various parts of the world have been putting on dance sessions on Zoom. We have taken over our dining room as a dance floor

with some markings to help us with the 6 other people who are now not there (the 'phantoms'). We dance in the comfort of our own homes, no travelling, no costs, to callers from Britain, America, Canada, Germany, Sweden, Australia plus more.

Sometimes there are over 80 devices joined on Zoom. Dancers from all over America, Canada and Europe including even China, Japan, Poland, Australia, Russia. We have joined in some worldwide charity dances which have included dozens of different callers at the event lasting for 6hrs and more.

It was very hard at first to imagine the other 6 phantoms, but, after practice, it has become easier, making us able to continue dancing and keeping fit whilst meeting and making even more new friends, now, from all over the world.

We now dance 7 days a week, sometimes 3 times in one day, at usually 1 to 2 hrs sessions. Without our dancing we would have gone stir crazy. Isn't technology fantastic?

Eventually we will be able to physically restart the clubs in our local halls, then we can invite you all to come along and join in the fun and friendship of Social & Modern Square Dance. I will tell you a little more about our favourite hobby another time.
