





REVERENT REFLECTIONS

In the Gospel stories we continually witness Jesus withdrawing to quiet paces to be alone so that he can spend time in prayer with God. This is something that all of us in Ministry are advised to do on a regular basis. At the beginning of September I spent a few days on retreat at Whalley Abbey in the beautiful Ribble Valley. I stayed in the Elizabethan manor house which is set in the stunning grounds and ruins of the 14th Century Cistercian Abbey on the banks of the river Calder. It is a place of hospitality, and the Diocese of Blackburn's new centre for Christian discipleship and prayer. It was wonderful to have a few days of peace and quiet to enjoy God's beautiful creation, to recharge my batteries and to

spend some time reflecting on the past eighteen months and to think about the future.

My prayer and walking retreat and was led by Mark Ireland, who is the Archdeacon of Blackburn. Each day we spent time walking in the surrounding countryside, joined in with the Whalley Abbey community in their rhythm of daily prayer in the ancient chapel and gathering each evening for a Bible reflection and to share our experiences of the day. On our first afternoon we assembled for an opening prayer walk around the Abbey ruins. As we walked Mark informed us about the history of the amazing monastic ruins of the Abbey and we would then pause to reflect as he chal-

lenged us with questions which related what we had seen and heard with our lives today. One of the places where we paused was on the site of the old octagonal Chapter House where part of the original tiled floor still exists under the turf where we were standing. The Chapter House was where the monks met after prayers each morning for a short business meeting, which was preceded by the reading of a chapter of the rule of St. Benedict (hence the name). St Benedict advised in his rule that whenever the community faced an important decision the views of the youngest member of the chapter should be sought, since God sometimes speaks to the whole community through the voice of its youngest members.

As we paused to reflect, Mark asked us to consider how good is the church we belong to at listening to the voice of its youngest members? Perhaps this is a question we can ask more generally in all of our communities as we move forward

from the times of lockdown. So often we plan things for our children and young people without pausing to ask them what they want. It is easy to overlook the useful contributions that our children and young people can make and leave them out of our decision making. Our communities should be places where all are valued equally, and all can serve according to their gifts.



June, will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone.


