REVERENT REFLECTIONS

Our journey through life can feel very hard at times, and with the high number of Covid cases due to the Omicron variant, it may seem to us that the pandemic will never end. It is often when times are hard that self-doubt creeps in. Sometimes we devalue ourselves because we compare ourselves to others and this leads to low self-esteem, a common problem today especially amongst young people who compare themselves to media images and have the pressures of doing well academically. There has been a sharp rise in mental illness due to the pandemic.

I would like to share these words written by Henri Nouwen who writes that we should always be ourselves:

Often, we want to be somewhere other than where we are, or even to be someone other than who we are. We tend to compare ourselves constantly with others and wonder why we are not as rich, as intelligent, as simple, as generous, or as saintly as they are. Such comparisons make us feel guilty, ashamed, or jealous. It is very important to realise that our vocation is hidden in where we are and who we are. We are unique human beings, each with a call to realise in life what nobody else can, and to realise it in the concrete context of the here and now. We will never find our vocations by trying to figure out whether we are better or worse than others. We are good enough to do what we are called to do. Be yourself!

In the Bible God promises that we are never alone because he is always with us. Isaiah gives us a wonderful message of joy and comfort, "I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you....... you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, Do not fear, for I am with you.

We can also feel assured that however long and hard this journey through the pandemic is, we are not alone, God is with us and eventually we will reach better times.

CARDS FIGHTING LONELINESS – A HALTON NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME CAMPAIGN

In October, we embarked upon a campaign to tackle loneliness in the winter months, where we asked local children to volunteer to create a card for someone in our community, with the intention of brightening their day. At the same time, we asked local residents to nominate someone to receive a card.

During October and November, 39 beautifully uplifting cards were hand delivered and a lot of wonderful conversations were enjoyed, together on their doorstep.

In December, we teamed up with The Red Door Cafe for our 'St Nic for a Neighbour' campaign with the aim to make a difference this Christmas! We specifically requested that children create Christmas cards, but also asked local residents to donate a small gift to accompany the card and to leave this at The Red Door. A staggering 260 Christmas cards were created and an astronomical 120 gifts donated! It was fantastic to see local schools, Beaver / Cub troops and the wider community all come together to support our campaign.

Thanks to everyone's generosity, I had the pleasure of dressing as an elf and hand-delivering 89 cards and gifts to Halton residents, where we shared stories, some happy and some sad tears, but most importantly, a smile. The sur-

plus cards and gifts were all donated to Age UK's Lancaster branch, for users of their 'Hospital Aftercare' service.

I would like to thank every child that volunteered, every person that donated a gift or nominated a recipient, for their involvement in this campaign. Without you, this wouldn't have been possible.

The campaign has now been adopted in both Caton and Brookhouse and I hope that the concept will soon extend to the wider Lancaster area, spreading kindness much further than the boundaries of LA2!

3 BRIDGES 10K RUNNING RACE



We committed to:

- Developing a Climate and Ecological **Emergency Plan**
- Reducing our collective emissions to net-zero by 2030
- Disclosing our progress on a yearly basis
- Continuing to share our ideas and achievements with others

As we go to press, we are in the process of appointing a student intern from Lancaster University. They will spend 140 hours working out our baseline emissions - what we emit now - and starting to scope where we can reduce emissions and increase biodiversity. The baseline will cover energy, purchasing, cleaning, transport, events, building maintenance, waste and food.

We are also planning to run an environmental project for local children, involving some of the environmental specialists and artists who work from the Mill. 

PLAY AREAS AND RECREATION AREA

The plans to improve the Recreation Area and play equipment at St Wilfrid's Park and the Centre are progressing.

- Recreation Area and works to the Centre: The planning application needs to provide a full tree survey and impact assessment, which should be completed in the near future.
- St. Wilfrid's Park: The current plans include a roundabout, balancing and

clambering equipment, bouncy seats, a climbing net, seating and possibly replacement swings.

• The Centre: We hope to install an aerial runway and embankment slide. The total cost of all this is likely to be around £100,000, so the Parish Council will be seeking a Public Works Loan of approximately £50,000 to be paid back over 10 years. The remaining sum will hopefully be covered by a combination of Section 106 money from the Story Homes development and grants.


