## HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Spring will be in full swing when you read this and our tended village areas will be looking colourful with narcissi, crocuses and the new shoots of the tulips and other spring bulbs we planted last autumn. The snowdrops, which have been abundant this year, will have finished, but we managed to plant up several more clumps in the Memorial/Jubilee garden whilst still 'in the green'.

The group is continuing to refurbish the Memorial/Jubilee garden during 2022 and hope to have a grand opening in the Summer. The gabion corner is our current focus with new seating planned for there and two new benches in the garden. A pictorial map is being developed and a video about our work is in production.

We are all looking forward to our day trip to RHS Bridgewater in June and expect to return home with an abundance of ideas and plants in tow.

Our gardening tip this edition is to **dead**-**head** your d**affodils**:

To keep your bulbs healthy and blooming year after year, remove faded flowers to stop them setting seed. Allow the leaves to yellow and die naturally, so that nutrients are returned to the bulb. If the weather's dry, it will help to water them and, if grown in pots, feed them weekly with potassium-rich fertiliser such as tomato food.

## HALTON HISTORY - WAR MEMORIAL CASUALTIES

#### Action on 23rd April 1915: (Part 1).

This date was one of tragedy for the people of Halton and in particular 3 families. 3 Halton men died this day on the Somme in the same area of conflict. They are commemorated where they fell.

Their orders for 23rd April 1915 state that "5th King's Own Royal Regiment, less one company, will follow the attack in reserve moving with its left on the Pilche – Ypres Road. The Battalions will move on a front of 500 yards."

As they deployed, they were met with heavy shellfire. they reached their position they came under machine- Immediately gun fire and rifle fire from the front and both flanks. Casualties were numerous from the outset. The advance was carried out in perfect order, every man pressing forward to the objective. In coming in line with the "Goodnight, goodnight beloved mine! troops of the attack, they were held up for lack of support. A halt was made and each man selected or made for himself cover. A large congregation included members of the Halton Home Defence League in charge of Mr. T Gibson. Flowers were sent.

Goodnight sleep well, my dear. (2x) May cherubim and seraphim watch over you and hover near.
