

REVERENT REFLECTIONS



As I write these reflections, everyone is very busy planning events to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee over the extend-

ed bank holiday from 2nd to 5th June. There are thousands of events planned across the UK including many taking place in our villages of Halton and Aughton. Her Majesty the Queen is the first British Monarch to celebrate this landmark anniversary of 70 years of service to the United Kingdom and Commonwealth. Whatever your feelings about the monarchy, no-one can deny the impressive dedication and commitment that Elizabeth, our Queen, has given to her royal duties. Her strong Christian faith has given her great strength, especially in times of adversity and has led her to promote Christian values at home and abroad. She continues to carry out her duties with grace and dignity despite her advancing age.

There is no doubt that Queen Elizabeth II sees her role as monarch as a vocation. The Archbishop of Canterbury describes how "Queen Elizabeth II has lived out her vocation as a loving and caring sovereign servant to her nation". At her Coronation in 1953, she committed herself to a lifetime of service to her people. We often use the word 'vocation' to describe a career, often in the caring pro-

fessions such as nursing or teaching. It can also be applied to a role like parenting. The word vocation means 'calling' so it is often used to describe the call some people have to the religious life or to priesthood. However, Christians believe that everyone has a unique or personal vocation, those gifts and talents that we all have which enable us to carry out tasks that enrich our lives and those of others.

We are now in the exam season for many of our children and young people. Sadly, many of them feel under great pressure to achieve academically. Society tends to judge people by their academic success rather than by the other gifts and talents they may possess. One of the local head teachers summed this up very well in the school newsletter when he advised parents of Year 6 pupils taking their SATS to remember that their child is more than a score. He wrote, "some children love tests and excel in them, and others don't show their potential under such conditions. Some children are amazing athletes, exceptional musicians or can cook a gourmet meal – these are skills they will take through life with them but are not assessed in SATS" We could all do well to remember this as we reflect on the gifts that have enabled Her Majesty the Queen to serve so faithfully over the last seventy years.

The driver will then help people, with their shopping, back onto the bus and return to Halton at 1pm.

In the months October to March, a staggering 737 cards and keepsakes were made by local children! With 96 recipients on my list, I hand delivered 387 general cards, 11 birthday cards, 8 posies, 86 keepsakes, 9 get well soon cards and 89 Christmas cards with a gift.

In December, the community came together and donated gifts, to be given alongside a handmade Christmas card. 260 Christmas cards were created and 120 gifts were donated. Dressed as an elf, I took to the streets to spread some Christmas cheer to our recipients (I'm not sure I'll ever live that down!) 147 surplus cards and 31 surplus gifts were given to users of Age UK Lancaster's 'hospital aftercare service'.



HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Our annual plant sale was held on 21st May 2022 and as this article was written and submitted for publication prior to this, the outcome of the sale is not known at this time. Thank you in anticipation of another bumper sale and many satisfied customers. Our Facebook post for Halton Gardening Group will always contain more up to date information.

I hope you all agree that the tulips and narcissi blooming in the village this year have been splendid. We chose tulips called Slawa and Ronaldo again but added a variety called Marianne. The white double headed narcissi are called Thalia and there are also varieties called Churchill and Pheasant Eye. They have graced the Memorial/Jubilee garden as if they have been there for years.

Planting continues in the Memorial/Jubilee garden as the borders take shape and the gabion corner is developed. We have applied a mineralised straw mulch to the beds to suppress weeds and to give the soil a boost. We are hoping it will prevent the hostas from being eaten by the slugs this year.

Two new benches are now in situ and we have purchased some new planters to replace the barrels in the cenotaph area. A further planter will be placed under the plaque between the benches and hopefully show off some beautiful blooms this summer. Have a look and see what you think. We have carefully documented our work so if you wanted to copy any of the planting in your own garden please ask for the plan. Our video is now complete, recording our work during the Covid -19 pandemic.

Our gardening tip for this issue is: "Now's the time to carry out the "Chelsea chop" on your herbaceous perennials. Cut back some stems by up to a half of their length as flower buds appear. This keeps plants more compact and delays flowering.

Make clean cuts above a growing point (node) with your secateurs. Suitable plants include phlox paniculata, echinacea purpurea and solidago. Sedums can also be cut back by around half their height so side shoots develop and bushier plants are produced."



HAPPENINGS AT HALTON MILL

HALTON MILL & THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

Back in late 2021, Green Elephant, the cooperative that runs Halton Mill, declared a climate and ecological emergency. We set ourselves the aim of being carbon neutral for our own emissions by 2030.

In early 2022, we were lucky enough to gain the support of a student, Sam Tellyn, from Lancaster University, to help us work out our current carbon emissions from operating our business. Since then he's been working with Mill staff and some tenants and has now come up with a figure.

As an already eco conscious building the results are, as we expected, low emissions compared to other similar sized buildings and similar businesses, but there's always room to improve. For instance, it made us realise that, despite using almost 100% renewable energy, there is still quite a lot of emissions from our energy use. Renewables are low carbon, not no carbon.

climate We are now working with Sam to formulate a plan of action to further reduce our emissions, increase the lton Mill, efficiency of our carbon usage, look at offsetting when there is no alternative (making sure the offsetting is real and not greenwash) and ultimately meet our goal ahead of 2030.

Following the work on our emissions, we are aiming to present the findings to our tenants, tutors and other users with the hope that this will assist them to find ways to reduce their own emissions. We are also looking at how we, as a Mill, can help and support them to do this and perhaps reward people - financially or otherwise - for doing so. In particular we will be looking at how people travel to the Mill, and if there is any way we can encourage people to walk or cycle more or to share lifts.



The Memorial was dedicated in 1920, almost certainly by the incumbent Rev. Hastings and probably close to 11th November. He was also a founding Trustee of the War Memorial Institute.
