REVERENT REFLECTIONS

What are you thankful for today? I am thankful for the beauty of creation. We live in a very beautiful part of the world and Loften think I must have one of the best vicarages in the Diocese with its superb views over the hills from the back of the house and over Morecambe Bay at the front. Nothing can beat the breathtaking beauty of the sunsets I see most days! I am very grateful for God's wonderful creation.

Gratitude is food for the soul. Meister Eckhart wrote "if the only prayer you say in your entire life is 'Thank you', that would suffice".

The journal of happiness studies found that participants who wrote three letters of gratitude over a three-week period displayed both increased happiness indicators and decreased symptoms of depression. Gratitude is powerful because it undoes pride and despair. Gratitude also punctures our contemporary culture of 'entitlement'. To express thanks is to take something out of the realm of 'a right' and into the realm of 'gift'.

Yet gratitude remains one of the easiest things in the world to forget. Thanksgiving needs to be intentional. Psychologists tell us that while we instantly and instinctively record disasters, we only remember good things when we deliber- Revd Susan Seed ately reflect on them for 15 seconds or more. We therefore need to actively hold on to the positive so that it imprints

and is digested by our soul. Some ways in which we can help our brains to register positive experiences are:

- 1. by keeping a journal of things we are grateful for,
- 2. sharing three good things each day with a friend or partner
- 3. going out of our way to express gratitude to others.

The prayer of Examen, developed by Ignatius of Loyola, is a tried and tested way to remember our gratitude to God. This is a prayerful reflection on each day's events through which to take notice of God's presence, give thanks for the things that have happened during the day and discern his direction for us. Reflecting with gratitude to God at the end of each day sustains us as we notice God's presence and provision and readies us to look for them again tomorrow. It is amazing how, when we are thankful, this can overflow into the lives of all those we encounter.

HALTON LUNE HYDRO -

Community Project

I am pleased to report good reliability of the hydro plant and equipment, although as per my last report in 2021, there has been a distinct lack of rain through this summer, as there was in 2021, hence both turbines have been off much of the time to leave sufficient river flow for the fish passes.

It could well be climate change, given the noticeable increase in maximum summer temperatures, but fortunately, increased electricity generation revenue associated with the increases in the cost of electricity, has allowed revenue to remain acceptable.

A word of warning however, with the blue green algae experienced in July and probably now history for 2022. It's considered to be promoted by nitrogen rich

fertilisers washed from fields, and is toxic, so care when swimming in still warm water - water that actually reached 23.4C August 15th by the hydro and mostly due to a small amount of water flowing over rather warm rocks.

Fish trapping for health checks was suspended under Environment Agency instruction last year and remains in place for 2022, given the number coming upstream are reducing year on year, and with thoughts on not adding stress to those that do make the journey. The EA are kept informed generally with the hydro abstraction and fish count reports that's quite a specialised task.

Hydro visits have been popular and very welcome, especially from groups having a keen interest in protection of the envi-





Burials and Commemorations of World War 1 Halton Casualties:

DoW - Died of Wounds, KIA - Killed in Action. The Menin Gate Memorial to the Missing, Ypres, Belgium commemorates 54,000+ missing.

Private 24800 Robert Aldren. 7th Batt. KORR. DoW 20/09/1917. Buried at Bus House Cemetery near Ypres, Belgium. Row 1. Grave 8. Age 24.

Private 26260 James Dowbiggin Angus – 2nd Batt. Scots Guards. Died 6/10/1918. Commemorated at Vin-en-Artois Memorial, Harcourt, Pas-de-Calais, France. Age 25.

L/Cpl. 1512 Thomas Burrow. 1/5th Batt. King's Own Royal Regiment. KIA with BEF, Ypres. 22/04/1915. Commemorated on the Menin Gate, Panel 12. Served only 7 days in France. Age 19.

Lt. Col. Edward Cadman-Cadman DSO. KORL Regt. Also 2nd/8th Batt. Royal Warwickshire Regiment. KIA 27/05/1918. Commemorated on Soissons Memorial, Department of de L'Asine, Picardie, France. Age 43.


