# A HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM ST WILFRID'S C E SCHOOL!



We have all returned to 2023 and the new term.

We are focusing on **Courage** 0003 and **Creativity** as our January/February monthly values. These will be explored through class discussion, songs and though our collective worship. In February, we will once again be taking members of the school choir to the Young Voices event in Manchester to sing alongside 7000+ other children. We will also be marking Safer Internet Day next month with information and workshops led by our pupils. We find of that one the main issues encountered is checking the age appropriate use of on-line games. This is the advice we promote in school; useful for anyone who cares for children:

SIX TOP TIPS FOR **KEEPING** CHILDREN SAFE WHEN GAMING (from internetmatters.org):

Take an active interest in the 1. games your children are playing to get to grips with how they work and why they enjoy playing them.

Ask who they play with online, 2. who they meet and talk to, and talk about what kind of language is being used. Make sure your child knows how abusive anti-social to report or behaviour.

3. For younger children. use 'airplane' mode settings on your tablet or smartphone. That way, they can play offline without making accidental purchases or connecting with someone thev don't know.

4. Use PEGI ratings and App store ratings to ensure your children are playing age appropriate games. Help children understand why some games are allowed and others aren't.

5. Gaming can be very addictive, so agree boundaries and how long they're allowed to play for and with whom they are allowed to play online with. Remind them that people may hide behind fake profiles and not be who they say they are

Teach your children to protect 6. themselves by thinking critically remind them not to share personal information and to keep gaming friends in the game only rather than adding them to their other social networks.

On Tuesday 10th January we held our Hot Chocolate Drop-in for any children who left St Wilfrid's last summer and are now in Y7. We love catching up with them and hearing how they are enjoying their high schools.

Our last Community Tea was held on Wednesday 25th January at 2pm when we served afternoon tea for senior village residents. Unfortunately, we only have 3 units in Caton alone for the whole Lune Valley to participate in, resulting in huge waiting lists.



# LUNE VALLEY COMMUNITY LAND TRUST News on Affordable Homes for Halton



#### MILL LANE AFFORDABLE COMMUNITY HOMES

Supply chain problems for the mechanical

ventilation/heat recovery (MVHR) systems caused a delay in completing the houses towards the end of 2022. Further delays, including mains water connections, have put the handover date back into February 2023. Such delays are common at the end of a development and we are confident that the first residents will soon be living in their warm, cosy houses and saving money on their heating bills.

All of the 13 rented homes have now been offered to qualifying households Halton with strong connections, confirming that we are helping to meet the local need for affordable homes. Applications for the 7 shared ownership homes were going well, until the sudden autumn downturn in the economy and the resulting problem of obtaining mortgages. South Lakes Housing has been working tirelessly with potential buyers to find solutions nearly all the shared and now ownership houses are sold. The CLT and SLH will be organising site visits and home familiarisation sessions for the new residents in the next few weeks. There will be a formal opening of the housing development, which will be known as Lune Walk. on March 9th.

#### PUBLIC OPEN (GREEN) SPACES

Work continues on finding a suitable site for a community orchard. Lune Valley Verges project based in Aughton is working with Lancaster City Council to improve the biodiversity of local verges. The initiators of the project will be advising interested parties in Halton, including the CLT, how this can be extended throughout the village.

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

Neighbourhood Plans define the vision and objectives of a parish, along with a set of underlying policies. These need to fit within the Lancaster District Local Plan. Once approved by residents, the policies within the Neighbourhood Plan can defend against inappropriate or undesirable development and help steer changes in the preferred direction. The Parish Council has successfully applied for a grant to help in the production of the new Neighbourhood Plan. This has allowed us to employ the of Kirkwells services Planning & Sustainability Consultants based in Burnley, who have helped various other local parishes produce Neighbourhood Plans.

There is a small group working on reviewing and amending the initial draft produced by Kirkwells. The next meeting will be held at 2pm on 9th February 2023 at the Centre. If you

would like to get involved, feel free to attend or get in touch with the Parish Clerk. More information can be found on the Parish Council website.

#### **CASTLE HILL UPDATE**

The working group is currently in the process of applying for grants. The order and size of any successful grants will dictate the timescales and order of work, so hopefully more information will be available in the next Prattle.

#### HALTON VOLUNTEER NETWORK

There was discussion at the recent Parish Council meeting about how to finalise the draft Emergency Plan for the village, which remains stuck at the stage of needing volunteers to fulfil various roles; if you would be willing to help then please contact the Clerk. The Parish Council will try and organise a joint with other local meeting organisations that also relv on volunteers to discuss possible ideas and solutions.



#### PARISH COUNCIL VACANCY

The Parish Council still has a vacancy for a volunteer Parish Councillor, which is a non-political position. A representative from Aughton would be particularly welcome.

If you feel there are things that could be improved around the village, then joining the council is a good start.

Current projects include Castle Hill, recreation area improvements, replacement equipment for the play areas and producing a Neighbourhood Plan. These need active support from councillors to progress them in a timely fashion.

The Parish Council is responsible for the following areas:

- Representing the views and interests of parishioners and acting as a medium for consultation and communication with both the City and County Councils.
- Play areas (St Wilfrid's Park, The Community Centre, Schoolhouse Lane)

- Open spaces (around The Centre, Quarry Road, the "Plantation") and some paths
- Considering any planning matters, e.g. potential developments within the parish
- War Memorial, Castle Hill, Burial Ground, allotments, bus shelters, bins

As with anything, what you get out of being a Parish Councillor will depend on what you are able to put in. How much time you can commit is largely down to the individual and what level of involvement you are hoping for. As a minimum, you would be expected to attend the monthly Parish Council meetings held on the 2nd Wednesday of each month.

If you are interested, then pop into the next meeting to see how we work and speak to the current councillors; alternatively visit our website or contact the Clerk. We welcome people from diverse backgrounds to help ensure we make sound decisions that are representative of the different perspectives within the parish.
