HALTON LUNE HYDRO

I am pleased to report that 2022 and 2023 so far, have been good —

especially as no serious flooding experienced and the often quite long dry spells are being well compensated by the increase in revenue for generated electricity.

This means that the proceeds going to the Halton Lune Trust are just about to increase, resulting in more funds being available for worthy local causes, so please consider making a grant application, which, to quote a part of the Charity Commission registration "Have a special emphasis on promotion of activities for public benefit within the Parish and surrounding area of Halton with Aughton that encourage the social involvement of all individuals and voluntary groups within the community."



I should also add that there is still plenty of rounded stone from a flood some time ago, so should you wish to collect some for the garden or a specific project, it's just a matter of contacting one of our team, or email myself on John.Blowes@haltonlunehydro.org.

Turning back to revenue; this depends greatly on operating for as long as possible in a 24hr period, and thanks here to our volunteer Duty Officers, who enjoy a walk and call in to record some figures for a given day - and get assistance if necessary, to remove the occasional tree branch and general debris, including plastic from the launder channel. responsibilities for salmon and sea trout, on this one of four UK Index rivers. Automatic counting is being recorded all the time and whilst there was an improvement last vear. numbers are significantly down compared to other years. It's far from proven, but pollution might have some responsibility, especially as we had the blue green algae floating on top of the water during July 2022. Warnings therefore again about swimming when algae is spotted anywhere in our local stretch of the river.

HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Have you visited the Halton Memorial/ Jubilee Garden recently? For readers new to the village, this is the garden next to the village Cenotaph, donated to the village in 1935 by the then Rector of the Parish. We have installed a Maggie Howarth mosaic – a beautiful butterfly - just in front of the gabion seating. We were able to do this thanks to the Anne Snowden remembrance fund. Anne was our much loved and much missed secretary who died last summer. We are confident she would have approved of this addition to her lovely garden design, and we thank her family for their support.

You may have seen us working in the Memorial/Jubilee Garden, usually on a Tuesday afternoon. Any additional volunteers are always welcome! Apart from the routine weeding and pruning, we have been replacing the apparently not-so-hardy perennials which have failed to survive the autumn rains and winter freezes. Many gardeners have found that plants which normally survive winters in the North West without any bother have not survived this year, and the March rains and April chills have not helped. Gardeners have to be optimistic, so we look forward to a warmer late spring and early summer and flourishing plants.

We continue to work on the wildflower bank and the terrace by The Centre, usually on a Wednesday afternoon, so

again, additional volunteers are always welcome! We are hoping that two of in the children's planters playground will have a beautiful show of wild flowers again this summer, while the middle one will be given over to growing herbs. Members will be replacing the winter plants and bulbs in the planters throughout the village shortly. We do ask that the village community encourages visitors and children to respect the plantings throughout the village. It is very discouraging when they are trashed, which sadly has happened several times recently.



The visit to RHS Harlow Carr gave us a good opportunity to see the development work that is going on there, and to admire the late winter and spring planting. Several of us were particularly enamoured of the Alpine House, and came away with more ideas for planting in the gabion seating. It was nice to welcome friends and families of HGG on the trip, and we thank Janet Theobald for the efficient organisation.

By the time you read this, we will have held the village Plant Sale, and we hope to be able to report a good attendance and income in the next edition of the Prattle. All proceeds go to village planting projects.

DATE FOR YOUR DIARY – Halton village Garden Safari will take place over the weekend of 1st and 2nd July. The programme and map are being finalised as I write. Tickets and full details will be available in advance of the event, so look out for posters and notices around the village nearer the time. We will have 18 gardens for you to visit, so you may need two days to cover them all. They are very varied in style and size, and are definitely not intended to be show gardens. The owners just love gardening and talking about plants and sharing useful information and tips with others. And, after all, most of us, gardeners or not, find it interesting to see what other people are doing with their garden spaces.

If you would like to join our group, you will be made most welcome. Our next meetings will be on June 6th and July 4th at 9:30 a.m. in Halton Mill.

LOCAL ELECTIONS

the help of the Halton Lune Trust the Parish Council bid for this land, though this proved unsuccessful. The successful bidder and any plans that they have for the land is unknown.

REVERENT REFLECTIONS

If you'd been at the Coronation at Westminster Abbey, who would you have wanted to be? The King? The Queen? The Archbishop οf Canterbury? I don't think so, with the eyes of the world upon us! I expect most of us would have liked to have been a guest so that we could have seen all the pomp and pageantry up close. If I'd been there, I would have liked to have been in the choir. It must have been fantastic to sing all those wonderful anthems. The most moving part of the Coronation service for me was the beautiful music. There is a quotation that says, 'music speaks where words fail', and it really does. I find that music speaks to me deeply and it was the music in the service that made me most emotional. I must admit that what I have missed most since being ordained is singing in a church

choir. Part of this is because singing in a choir means that you are part of a community working together both for enjoyment and to praise God.

The Coronation service was all about serving. It began with a child of his Maiesty's Chapel Royal, Samuel Strachan, addressing the king to welcome him. The king replied with the words "in his name and after his example I come, not to be served but to serve". In his sermon the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, said that service is about love in action, and living life for the sake of others is what binds us together. He gave examples of active love in the care for the most vulnerable, the way we nurture and encourage the young, and in the conservation of the natural world, all of which have been the priorities in the life of our king. Jesus is recorded in the gospels frequently as eating with people. He was very much a part of whichever community he found himself in.

We also recognise that we belong to a global community. Life in all its fullness is a life of peace and the desire for peace should shape our actions and prayers. The truth is that we are all part of a wider community in which we find and offer mutual support. Life is found through serving those around us

whether they are part of our local community or thousands of miles away across the world.
