

HALTON LUNE HYDRO


I am pleased to report that several members of our community have volunteered to be "Duty Officers" or DOs, which means calling into the Hydro at some point during a given day to take a few readings and report any abnormalities, after a period of training - and in fact a pleasant walk or cycle ride.

In terms of finances, I write following low rainfall months of May and June, which reduced Hydro output and thus revenue, although given an electricity export contract locked in when electricity prices were very high, the year end result is expected to enable significant donations to the Halton Lune Trust - so do please consider applying for grants for worthy causes, within the Parish of Halton with Aughton.

We did in fact take advantage of the low river to undertake routine maintenance and replace the last of five galvanised steel turbine inlet screens with stainless steel, which are much stronger and easier to clean. The turbine blades were also checked and found to be in good condition - so, a "fit for purpose" renewable energy asset that should continue to do the job for many years to come.

Burton & Rigby Educational Foundation, Aughton (in the Parish of Halton with Aughton)

The trustees of the Burton & Rigby Educational Foundation will be meeting late in September 2023 to consider applications for grants on behalf of pupils and students attending educational establishments other than primary schools.

Under the terms of the trust the trustees will consider applications from candidates who are boys or girls resident in the Parish of Halton with Aughton who, in the opinion of the trustees, are in need of assistance, and who will not have reached their nineteenth birthday by 1st September 2023. The trustees are keen to attract applications from all sections of the community and particularly from those families where any grant from the trustees will make the biggest difference. If applicants are eligible for the pupil premium grant it would be helpful if that is stated in the application.

Awards are made at the discretion of the trustees and in the allocation of benefits the trustees are required to have regard to the promotion of education in accordance with the principles of the Church of England.

Applications, in the form of a letter, should set out details of the school or other educational establishment attended and information about the educational progress of the candidate. It has been an extremely successful year for Halton Gardening Group with two well attended events held in the village.


It is so encouraging to know that the efforts the HGG members put in earlier in the year to raise plants from seed, from cuttings and from splitting existing plants are well appreciated. This was shown by the attendance and success of our plant sale in May. Once again people turned out in numbers to purchase the herbs, veg plants, perennials, annuals, jams and chutneys on the Centre field.

Our first Garden Safari since 2017 also went ahead over the weekend of 1 & 2 July and the rain just about held off on both days. Over 200 people followed the trail around the village and used our local businesses for refreshments. Luckily, the 19 gardens had been refreshed after the heatwave with copious amounts of rain, much to the relief of all the participants.

The visitors came from far and wide – we even had a cyclist from Bristol who was on his way to Grange to visit Yewbarrow House gardens. He was also using the trains in case you were wondering.

The visitors seemed to enjoy the very varied gardens and many took photos for inspiration for their own gardens. Many old friends and acquaintances visited and it was good to catch up with them. It was a very sociable event.

People from villages close by were impressed with our efforts in making Halton a more pleasant place to live and links were forged. Many asked if we would be doing it again soon, as they didn't have time to visit all the gardens. We are considering making this a two yearly event and would like to encourage more villagers to come



forward and offer to open their gardens to visitors. All participants thoroughly enjoyed the experience although the weekend did prove quite tiring. Let us know if you wish to be involved next time, then we can start the ball rolling to make it a spectacular event in 2025. Finally, we thank all the ticket sellers and participant gardeners for their hard work, especially those who are not members of our group.

Both events raised over £1000 each which we plan to spend refurbishing the Centre terrace and developing the wildflower bank, planting up the gabion baskets and replacing plants lost during the winter of 22/23 in the Memorial Jubilee garden and buying new bulbs for the spring 2024 display, as well as maintaining our other planting areas.

A recent spate of vandalism has necessitated the replacement of a large expensive planter at the Cenotaph and the replanting of the flower tub at the roundabout bus stop, following the theft of the newly planted annuals.

Our annual Picnic will be held on 1st August in the MJG from 12:30pm. Everyone is welcome, so please bring your own lunch and a drink, members will provide cakes and ice cream. Picnic blankets and fold up chairs may well prove useful. Please note parking is extremely limited.

NEWS FROM THE 1ST HALTON SCOUT GROUP

As we approach the summer holidays Scouting in Halton is going from strength to strength, with a new Sauirrels section launching on Wednesday afternoons between 4 and 5pm. We will also be starting a parent rota so we have an extra adult each week helping. Beaver highlights over the last couple of months have included starting their camp blankets, learning about Beavers around the world and a visit to Eggcup. They will be raising money and collecting for the food bank next term as part of their Community impact badge.

Sorrel and Mark are doing an outstanding job running the scout section after I stepped down from leading the group, to the extent that I now only need to go down now and again to help with those sessions where I have permits that they don't, or for activities that I have more experience in.

On the 7th to 9th July Beavers, cubs and scouts had a joint camp up at Littledale scout camp, where they enjoyed lots of different activities, including crate stacking, tomahawk throwing. playing on the assault course, and going for a hike on the Sunday morning. The weather was a real mixed bag, with some glorious weather on Friday night and Sunday. and thunder storms and torrential rain on the Saturday. When you're outside or under canvas it can be quite a daunting experience for young children lightning flashes and heavy with thunder going on around you. We just managed to get everything packed up and back to the scout hut on the Sunday before the thunderstorms hit again and the skies opened. This was the largest group of children we have taken on a camp in many years (33 in total), and it was a credit to the leaders many adults who had and the volunteered to help that it went so smoothly.

I think all the leaders will be looking forward to a well earned rest over the summer holidays, and I'm expecting great things from the whole group when we all get back to scouting again after the break.

We are delighted to have been able to restart exercise classes in our beautiful Recreation Room this summer and we



are set to continue from Tuesday 12th September for the Autumn term. Our instructor is Gabi Crossley, who lives locally, and is fully trained and insured for a range of exercise classes.

There are two consecutive classes each Tuesday morning: at 9:30am a strength circuit with resistance bands and body weight exercises and sometimes light weights, which is scalable to all levels of experience, and at 10:30am a Pilates style mobility class (this blends Pilates, yin yoga, mobility and myofascial stretching). Tree surgeons: The Parish Council may agree to take the occasional load of chippings (note: not rubbish) if it is agreed in advance and the Clerk oversees the drop-off.



LANCASTER SLAVERY FAMILY TREES EXHIBITION

...at Halton Mill To 30 August. Open 9-5 Mon-Sun. Evenings by appointment (call 07778737681).

In 2021, the Lancaster Black History Group's "Slavery Family Trees Project" worked with several schools, university students, voluntary organisations, community and faith groups from across the district - including Caton Primary School - to research and record some of Lancaster's most prolific merchant families involved in transatlantic slavery. The exhibition draws on research from this project that has examined the intertwining of the familial branches which profited from this abhorrent trade - including the Hodgson family from Caton.

Thomas Hodgson built Low Mill in Caton and he and his brother John were very involved in slavery shipping. The first historical mention was in 1765 when Thomas was "appointed captain of the Pitt for Miles Barber out of Lancaster, destination S. Carolina with 64 slaves". By 1796 the two brothers were using 30 different ships, and sold their slaves in 10 different Caribbean ports, the most popular being Dominica, followed by Jamaica.

In his later life Thomas returned to Caton to live. He had 7 children, of whom Isaac and Adam became active abolitionists. Thomas died at Caton in 1817, clearly, judging by his church memorial tablet, held in affection by the locals.

In facing the past more honestly, the Lancaster Black History Group hopes to transform the future.

Three years ago, after the murder of George Floyd, a group of neighbours at Lancaster Cohousing in Halton formed a Black Lives Matters discussion group. Over those three years, the group has continued to hold weekly meetings in which many books, articles, films, and programmes have been discussed. The group is very pleased to be able to bring this exhibition to Halton in partnership with the Lancaster Black History Group. During the life of this exhibition we will be moving our weekly meetings to Halton Mill and all are welcome to join us on Wednesday mornings during August from 9:30 – 11a.m. for a varied programme of recorded talks and discussion sessions looking at the slave trade, reparations, and other related issues.
