



HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Halton Gardening Group is absolutely thrilled and humbled to have been awarded the King's Award Voluntary Service. This is the highest award a local voluntary group can receive in the UK and is equivalent to an MBE. We are one of only 262 voluntary groups to receive the award this year. The King's Award for Voluntary Service aims to recognise outstanding work by local volunteer groups to benefit their communities. The Award was created in 2002 to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's Golden Jubilee, and following his accession, His Majesty the King emphasised his desire to continue the Award. We join the Centre @ Halton, who received the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service in 2020. There can't be many villages with two such awards, so we can all be doubly proud. We are very much looking forward to receiving our Award Crystal and Certificate from the Lord

Lieutenant of Lancashire, Mrs. Amanda Parker JP, in the summer.

We are delighted that our group's work has been recognised in this wav. However, we could not do what we do without the support of the community in Halton with Aughton. We thank you all for your support of our fundraising plant sales and garden safaris over the years, and for the many personal donations you have made to help us fund the projects we have undertaken in the village. We thank past and present volunteers and supporters for their physical labour, moral support and encouragement, and we look forward to many more years of community gardening in the village.

We held our Annual General Meeting in October (without knowing of the award!). We changed our usual practice and moved the meeting to the evening in the hope that more people would be able to come and share



refreshments afterwards. We were very pleased that so many volunteers and supporters were able to join us. Monica Williams, chair, presented a report which outlined the successes and achievements of the last year, including the very successful plant sale in May and the garden safari in July. We underwent a rigorous assessment process for the KAVS in December last year, and reflection during this process led to some minor amendments to our constitution. We will continue to maintain the planters, Memorial Jubilee Garden, Centre Terrace and Burial Ground in the year to come, with some concerted effort being put into the very challenging wildflower bank on the field at the Centre. As always, we welcome new members to our meetings and/or to help out with the gardening. Please do contact us if you would like to join us. No gardening experience is necessary – we continue to learn from each other.



We have planted over 700 bulbs in the autumn. village this This indication of our optimism, because the weather last winter and early spring meant that many bulbs. especially the earlier ones, simply rotted in the ground. However, we were particularly successful with the tulips in the borders in the Memorial Jubilee Garden, so we have enhanced the planting there. Thank you to all those who came out to help with this mammoth task. We were able to take advantage of fine, if rather chilly, weather to complete the task.

We now enter a relatively quiet period for gardeners. Our next monthly meeting will be on Tuesday February 6th 2024, when we will begin to plan for all our regular and new activities and fund raising once again. In the meantime, we are looking forward to our Christmas Lunch at the Red Door in early December.

the heart than our usual updates are. You will have seen from one of our recent newsletters that we lost one of main hirers when Preschool our returned to **Furnace** Barn. This represents a considerable financial loss of around 40% of our hire income. This coupled with the recent fuel price increases has put us in an unsecure financial situation. The other recent blow to the Centre is the upcoming retirement of Maureen Richardson. Maureen has been with the Centre for many years and is known to many as the beating heart of The Centre. A number of groups that are really important to this community wouldn't be what they

are today without the determination and devotion that Maureen has given to

them. I will write more about Maureen's

accomplishments and dedication to the

community of Halton at a later date.

These two significant circumstances come together to put the Centre in a difficult situation. The financial position we are now in means we are not able to replace Maureen's role or the number of hours she put into The Centre. This means that without the community support, there are a few groups that may not be able to continue. Over the coming weeks we will be putting out pleas for individual groups to be returned to the community.

Our vision for The Centre @ Halton over the coming months and years is to

be in the community, for the community, by the community. And we really want to stand by this going forward.

As an example, pre-pandemic, the toddler group was run by a group of people from within our community. Some were mums with young children, some had older children. The group worked on a small rota for someone to run a craft activity, someone making teas and coffees, someone serving the snack and someone else to run the story and song time. Everyone on that rota and everyone who attended chipped in to help set up the room and tidy away at the end. The group collected their own entrance charges and paid rent to the Centre. This is the model we would like to use to return some of our groups to the community. We will start with the Baby and Toddler group and eventually groups such as Soup and a Song and Luncheon Club will follow suit.





Reporting environmental issues: Have you tried the 'Love Clean Streets' app yet? You can download this onto your

phone and use it to report potholes, flytipping, graffiti and any other environmental issue. The city and county councils will then respond as appropriate. Not got a smart phone? No problem — call the city council on 01524 582 491 to make a report.

Home Improvement Agency: did you know that the city council has a handyperson service for the over 65s and people with disabilities? There's no charge for the handyperson – you only pay for the materials they use. And there also disabled facilities grants to cover the cost of any works done to help keep disabled people safe and well in their homes. GRANTS FOR TREE PLANTING AND TRADITIONAL BOUNDARIES

Thanks to a grant of almost £200,000 from National Grid's Landscape Enhancement Initiative, the Forest of Bowland Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty Partnership is working with landowners and farmers to filter views of the high voltage electricity pylons along the north-western boundary of the AONB.

Projects include woodland planting, the creation and management of native hedgerows and the restoration of dry stone walls.

Tree and hedgerow planting in the right places can help to strengthen the connection between important ecological habitats, provide shelter for stock, benefit wildlife and improve biodiversity and water quality.

Forest of Bowland AONB Project Officer, Sandra Silk, said, "Woodland planting areas don't have to be large. In fact, we're looking for small-scale sites, such as field corners, cloughs and small copses, which will suit the landscape and existing field patterns."

The programme is being supported by UK conservation charity, the Woodland Trust, who are providing fully funded woodland saplings and plant protection. In addition, the Trust are offering "tree cages". These are small groups of four or five trees protected by timber fencing, which offer an

effective way of incorporating field trees into the landscape.

As well as offering tree stock and protection, the funding can support the cost of planting and stock proof fencing. Projects need to take place before the end of March 2024. There is also the possibility of funding for dry stone wall restoration between April 2024 and March 2025.

Projects must meet certain criteria and funding is limited and, therefore, cannot be guaranteed.

The area covered by the funding stretches from Halton and Aughton, through Quernmore, to the area north of Ortner and Ellel Crag quarry. Anyone interested in finding out more can contact Sandra by emailing sandra. silk@lancashire.gov.uk or by calling the AONB office on 01200 448000.




