

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN - INFORMAL CONSULTATION

The plan is a set of local planning policies which help guide decisions about development in the Parish within the context of Lancaster City Council's District Local Plan. It covers aspects of planning which are important to the parish and not covered by the District Local Plan. The Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Group has particularly focused on highlighting the importance of various green spaces around the village, so feedback on these proposals would be welcomed. It has reached the stage where we can ask for informal feedback from residents, so we are planning to make it available for review and comments for four weeks between Monday 8th April and Sunday 5th May.

We will endeavour to ensure that the draft plan and response forms are available in various locations, such as:

- · The Centre;
- · Aughton Recreation Room;
- · Halton Mill.

Public drop-in sessions will be held in the Centre on:

- Thursday 25th April between 3pm & 7pm;
- · Saturday 27th April between 10am & 1pm.

For those living in and around Aughton a public drop-in session will be held at



Aughton Recreation Room on Friday 26th April from 7pm to 10pm.

The draft plan, supporting documents and the response form can be found on the Parish Council website (https://www.haltonwithaughton-pc.gov.uk/neighbourhood-plan/) and via the QR code above.

Following this consultation, the feedback from residents and other consultees will be reviewed and amendments will be considered to the plan, prior to the formal Regulation 14 consultation stage.

Spring is sprung! As I write this article there is a mixture of sunshine and showers, hopefully not battering the daffodils too much. I'm looking forward to seeing the flower bulbs that the Gardening Group planted last autumn. We had a lovely display in the memorial Jubilee garden last year and it was enhanced this year with the addition of some heritage daffodils, as well as more tulips. Bulbs were put in the planters too and in other sites around the village, providing lots of colour.

Looking ahead - our plant sale has become а popular and regular occurrence. Our next sale will take place on 18th May on the field at the Centre. The plant sale opens at 2pm and finishes at 4pm. We have been delighted with the generosity of villagers and people from further afield who have dug deep in their pockets at our previous plant sales and garden gate sales. We hope this year's sale will be a successful one too. There will be members' perennials from own gardens, a range of bedding plants,

herbs and vegetable seedlings, preserves and more. Please give us plenty of space while we are setting up before the plant sale opens and avoid entering the sale area, as it takes time to sort out all the plants.

Join us - more members are most welcome, no gardening experience is necessary. There may be some weeding or other tasks to help with at the Memorial Jubilee Garden for example. We were entertained on a February afternoon by digging up tough weeds like docks and comfrey in the wild flower bank on the edge of the Centre field. Many hands certainly made light work. We will add more wild flowers there and in the autumn plant some daffodils similar to the wild ones in the Lake District. More digging may be required! Feel free to join us and contribute whenever you can.

Our meetings are normally on the 1st Tuesday in the Engine Room at The Mill from 10 am to 12 noon. The April meeting is a week later due to the Easter weekend, on Tuesday 9th April. Subsequent meetings are on Tuesdays 7th May, 4th June, and 2nd July. There's no meeting in August. We resume in September. Members do not have to attend very meeting but we would welcome you any time. We are hoping to get another speaker in the autumn and there will be our AGM. Details will be announced later, check out the website!

We have renewed our affiliated membership of the RHS (Roval Horticultural Society) and we advice from them. Here's what they suggest for April: deadhead bulbs which helps energy to go back into the bulb for next year. Don't cut off the leaves until they've died gone yellow. Keep deadheading spring bedding to encourage more flower production.

Prune lavenders to tidy them up but don't cut into old brown woody stems as they won't regrow. Keep on top of weeding but let some dandelions flower as they are good for bees.

Fancy making your own compost? It's a much better use of compostable material than putting it in the rubbish bin and then to landfill. It saves money too. Use vegetable and fruit peelings, grass clippings, flower deadheads, chopped up stalks and prunings, shredded paper, and brown cardboard ripped up (remove parcel tape and labels). Definitely no bread, meat, or leftover food. Make a compost bin with old pallets, scrap wood, or use a 'dalek' style bin with a lid. Making compost works best with a mixture of 'green' and 'brown' stuff. A pile of lawn clippings will not do much on its own. Worms will transform the mixture into lovely compost. This process can take a year or so, it pays to think ahead.


