24/12/05 To consider and approve reports:

a) District Councillor Report

From District Cllr Sommerville:

- The leadership of the council has passed to Cllr Caroline Jackson from the Green Party, leading a Cabinet with members from the Greens, Liberal Democrats and Morecambe Bay Independents. Labour have joined the Conservatives in opposition.
- Bin days will of course change over Christmas: https://www.lancaster.gov.uk/news/2024/nov/christmas-waste-and-recycling-collections
- Council phonelines and the customer service centre will remain open until 3pm on Christmas Eve. Phonelines will be back open on Friday, December 27 and the customer service centre will open on Monday, December 30. Both will then close again on New Year's Day.
- Lots of work is being done on regeneration especially in Morecambe
- Climate-wise we are all pleased that the Government Inspector has held up our Climate Emergency Review of the Local Plan basically meaning that we can demand better quality new homes from developers, with improved protection against flooding, more thought given to nature and sustainable travel, etc.
- There has also been some noise across the county about a plan from some Labour MPs for new unitary authorities in Lancashire i.e. merging Lancaster District with the likes of Wyre and Blackpool and doing away with the county council. City councillors are (unsurprisingly) not too impressed. We may get a better idea of whether this is what the Government are planning when they release their white paper on local government deregulation expected shortly.
- Finally the district now has a Local Area Energy Plan (LAEP) to guide our actions over the next 15 years to achieving a low carbon future.

b) Open Spaces, allotments & burial ground

Open Spaces

Completed/In Progress

- Large bin on the link path by the orchard has been removed and a dog bin added further towards High Rd
- Grit ordered ready for colder weather.
- Removal of stepping logs removed from Junior play area

<u>Planned</u>

- Repainting lines in the car park started but the weather was poor so it may have to wait until the spring.
- Adjusting/repairs Junior Play area gates repairs started.
- Removal of 2 x planters from Junior play area.
- Installing the St Wilfrid's benches
- Skip hire

Open Spaces

- The top shackles on the nest swing were very worn and needed replacing asap. New shackles have been ordered and will be fitted once they arrive.
- The Tree Survey has been completed. Only one tree has been identified as needing removal a Sycamore by the pitch: "Not suitable for long term retention. Remove whilst safe to do so. Fell to ground level or retain stump of 3m height for habitat if desired". A tree works planning application has been raised (24/0239/TPO).
- Action: to obtain quotes for the removal of the sycamore.
- As part of the Tree Survey the orchard area on the link path was reviewed. It was recommended that apple trees were removed and replaced with smaller, ornamental trees, e.g. flowering cherry.
- It was resolved: to remove the 2 apples trees nearest the link path and include in the tree works quote.
- The wall on Low Road bordering the plantation is leaning towards the road and the wall on High Road is leaning into the plantation.
- It was resolved: report the leaning walls (top & bottom) to County Highways who are believed may be responsible for walls bordering highways.

Burial Ground

• One of the headstones is facing the wrong direction. The funeral directors have been asked to investigate.

Allotments

• Invoices sent out to all allotment holders. The invoice also reminded tenants that there is no longer a communal compost and that all materials should be composed on their own plot.

c) HCA

- Christmas fair was successful, with lots of volunteers.
- 70 out of 100 tickets sold so far for the Ceilidh.

d) Finance Report

- A VAT claim of £6,656.20 has been received.
- No invoice from LCC for the bins yet.
- Cllr Rigby has verified the bank reconciliation for November

From a local resident:

Complaint that the bin that used to be in the lay-by on Kirkby Lonsdale Rd nr. Laverick Rd has gone.

Clerk has reported this to Lancaster City Council.

From a local resident:

Complaint about the speed calming measures on Church Brow:

I wondered if I could raise issue with the 'traffic calming' on Church Brow! Firstly it is definitely not working which I am sure is of no news to you. Secondly, getting in and out of our garage which is on the intersection of ChurchBrow/Church Street is exceedingly difficult and at times due to the aggression and impatience of drivers - dangerous. Would it please be possible to raise this issue with the City Council? Since the Bypass and the massive increase to the Halton population traffic has increased both in number and poor quality driving!

The Parish Council has previously raised their disappointment in the speed calming measures with Highways. **Action:** Clerk to respond to the resident, recommending that they contact County Highways.

From a local resident:

Complaint about the outline planning application for 80/90 homes:

You may not be aware but there are new documents available on life for the outline planning permission by Applethwaite homes for up to 80 new homes on Low Road, Halton next to Wrenman Homes.

The parameters plan show houses will overlook the river and ruin views from that most beautiful of walks. They should be set much further back surely? What is the point of National Landscape designation if the views are destroyed?

Sadly the ancient hedge which runs parallel with Low Road is to be removed for sight -lines. This beautiful feature of our landscape is on maps of 1847 (177 years ago) and on hedgerow regulations of the same date, so one can assume it was already a significant hedge when it was added. The vast majority of this hedgerow is within Forest of Bowland National Landscape and is on the area of the land laid out as green space. Everything should be done to retain as much of it as possible surely?

I dread to think how Low Road will cope with all this additional development as the road is in a diabolical state. Sorry to be the bearer of rotten news.

Action: Clerk to respond to the resident thanking them for highlighting the importance of this hedge.

24/12/07 To consider approving the Regulation 15 Submission of the Neighbourhood Plan and associated documents

- The Steering Group met on 27th November to review the final changes to the NDP and associated documents. They have recommended that the plan is ready for Regulation 15 Submission.
- Lancaster City Council has reviewed the list of statutory consultees that were approached for comment during
 the Reg. 14 consultation and have confirmed that the list was correct. They are also reviewing the plan to see
 whether a further screening is required. If new screenings are needed, then it could take at least 6 weeks.
- There was discussion of how to handle the comment from the Local Lead Flood Authority.
- It was resolved: that the current response to the Local Lead Flood Authority comment is adequate.
- It was resolved: to submit the Neighbourhood Development Plan and associated documents to Lancaster City
 Council (Regulation 15 of Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012) once screening has been completed by
 Lancaster City Council.

24/12/08 To consider updates on the:

a) Castle Hill Project

- Tree works have been completed and invoiced. Work on improving the access gate has started and should be finished before Christmas. Fencing likely to start early in the new year.
- Final stages are to organise an interpretation board, picnic table and grass reinforcement.
- An historic re-enactment on site has provisionally been booked for 12th April.

b) Lancashire Orchard Grant

- Bannister Hall are an approved supplier so a quote will be sought from them.
- Action: See if some small cherry trees might be available for the link path.

24/12/09 To consider fencing quotes for the allotment area

- One company has quoted for the allotment fencing.
- Action: Additional quotes to be sought
- The area to the right of the gate towards the wall adjacent to the football pitch is now over full of dumped allotment waste, compost, manure and wood chippings. The fencing contractor will need this to be removed prior to installing the new fencing.
- It was resolved: Clerk to obtain a quote for removing the material.
