• Asking on behalf of other allotment holders that bays for manure and woodchip be provided by the council. Plot holders have offered to manage the area.

b) Open Spaces, allotments & burial ground

General

Open Spaces

- The path behind the wall that runs from Park Lane to the Crook O'Lune is overgrown. It is not entirely clear who is responsible for that section of path, though the grounds staff have strimmed it in the past.
- Action: Cllr Lamb to ask Erica.

Burial Ground

• Planning Enforcement have dropped off a letter to the van owners asking them to move since they do "not support a change of use to residential in this location". Highways have stated that they have no powers to move them.

Allotments

- The allotments have been inspected. Plots 8b & 9b were very overgrown, so warning letters have been sent.
- The rules lack clarity on the degree to which weeds and/or wildflowers are tolerated. Additionally various small trees, including conifers and willow are present on plots.
- Action: Review the rules in the autumn.

c) HCA

• In general, the Centre is running well. However, anti-social behaviour has become a problem in the last few weeks around the Centre. This has included throwing rocks at house windows and breaking one. Police have been informed, including the local PCSO. The Police are seeking to identify the individuals.

A local community group

- The Friends of Lapwing Fields Green Space have asked whether the council would support their nomination of the area between Slyne-with-Hest and Bolton-le-Sands as a Local Green Space.

County Councillor for Skerton

I have read in the Lancaster Guardian that you have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. I don't know how long you have had the vacancy, but if you are struggling to find someone, I could cover the position until your next set of elections. I have had a look at the website and believe I may be eligible by virtue of living within 3 miles of the parish boundary. I am currently the Lancashire County Councillor for Skerton, so understand the duties of the Parish Council and would not be viewing it as a party-political role.

Halton Lune Hydro

The timber steps from the hydro to the upper level require attention. We have repaired them in the past but think this may be a Parish council responsibility. The Parish clerk will be asked for comment.

• **Action**: Clerk to contact the County PROW team about the general poor state of the whole path to the Crook O'Lune.

25/07/07 To receive and consider updates:

- a) Neighbourhood Plan
 - The external examiner invited the Parish Council to respond to comment on the Reg. 16 responses by the 9th July. The Steering Group agreed to send a short response highlighting the previous comments from the LLFA.
- b) King's Orchard
 - There is an aim to plant trees in the paddock in the autumn.
- c) Mill Lane play area
 - There was a recent email from the Public Realm Supervisor for Parks & Open Spaces:
 - I just wanted to touch base regarding the potential upcoming s106 agreement and land transfer of Mill Lane Halton. It's currently sitting with our legal team at the moment, and I'm not sure at this stage what the outcome will look like. If it does get transferred in its current state without a contribution attached, we will need to source external funding to be able to renovate the play area. As a district council, most of the funding pots available do not allow us to apply, and we have to instead go through a constituted group. When/if the time come, would this be something you would be interested in being involved with?
 - Action: Clerk to confirm that the Parish Council is willing to help in whatever way it can.

25/07/08 To consider the annual play area inspection report, including the moderate risk identified

- All equipment has been assessed as low or very low risk apart from the swings at St Wilfrid's Park which are a moderate risk due to the top bars being rotten.
- It was resolved: to remove the swing since the aim is to refurbish the area

25/07/09 To consider building holding areas for manure and woodchip at the allotments

- Allotment holders are keen to have woodchip as well as manure and self-organised a poll which indicated fairly strong support. They also offered to keep any holding area tidy.
- It was resolved: to build two bays to hold manure and mulch.

25/07/10 To consider process for the Section 106 request relating to 23/01327/OUT

• District Councillor McGowan was contacted about the Section 106 request made last year to see if it was acceptable to Planning. The response from planning was as follows:

The Parish Council should be thinking about any planned or future proposals to enhance their community assets, in particular open space provision. There is more chance of potentially securing S106 money **if the Council** (either via the planning team or public realm teams) **know about any projects the PC wish to undertake to improve their facilities**. For example, if they need to provide additional play provision or are required to enhance existing facilities. This could include improvements to football pitches, the MUGA and skate park, fencing, external lighting etc. generally anything to do with open space and its associated infrastructure.

However, it is important to note, we can only secure s106 contributions where there are identified deficiencies in provision locally. This is why we have not secured monies previously as the facilities in the village are relatively good compared to many other areas. Unless we are informed about problems/requirements/projects we are less likely to be made aware of deficiencies in provision. We will also rely on our open space assessments (the evidence base) to identify if deficiencies exist.

Action: Clerk to add an item planning such work to the agenda in autumn.

25/07/11 To consider and approve revised Burial Ground Rules

- The Burial Ground Rules and Fees have been updated to try and clarify the position of resident vs non-resident.
- It was resolved: To accept the revisions, apart from leaving in the rule about memorials in the Woodland area.
