PLAY AREAS, INCLUDING MILL LANE

The Mill Lane play area recently failed a safety inspection, so it has been closed by the owner. It was installed around 20 years ago by the initial developer of the Town End Way estate and after they responsibility became bankrupt, passed to the residents' association; however, they are struggling to find a way to fund the necessary maintenance. A long-term solution for funding and maintaining it is required, otherwise the play area will be lost.

The Parish Council agreed in principle to leasing the land, subject to terms and conditions. This play area could then be included in the plans to refurbish the play areas around the village, particularly St Wilfrid's Park.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

This seems to ebb and flow but often increases during the holiday periods. If you see or encounter any such behaviour, we encourage you to directly report it to Lancashire Police either via their website or via the Non-Emergency 101. This is unlikely to have an immediate response from the police, but we have been assured that police will prioritise areas with high numbers of reported incidents.

NEWS FROM HALTON MILL

Halton Mill welcomes back its annual Millfest in September, with live music, arts and craft stalls, family and wellbeing activities, street food and craft beer, and lots more in-between! Millfest takes place on Saturday September 14 from 12pm - 8pm, both inside and outside the mill, so we're hoping the weather will behave itself once again!

We welcome back The Melodrome Mobile Stage which will be hosting live bands and musicians including Spinsters, Good Boy Nikko!, Pete Moser, The Rice Band, Blanty and The Crux.

There'll be fun and games on stage too with The Tuneless Choir and Bush Rush, and lots of opportunities for the audience to get involved.

New for this year we welcome Sand Arts and Crafts, The Rainbow Room, a willow workshop, sound therapy by the riverside, and some amazing inflatable art installations from Space Cadet. Lazy Dog Guitars will also be returning with their handmade guitars which you can have a play on in the garden.

EVENING BUSES ARE BACK IN HALTON.

Great news – late evening buses will return to Halton on Monday 2nd September. This follows a campaign by local residents and the District Bus Users' Group. Thank you to everyone involved.

The new journeys will run hourly on route 81 (via Church Brow and Low Road), with the last bus back from Lancaster at 22:52. Stagecoach will run these buses, rather than Lonsdale Buses who operate the 81 earlier in the day. Fortunately the need to use return or day tickets with the same operator is not the problem it once was, as most people will be buying £2 single tickets

(or just £1 after 7pm and all day Sunday).

Lonsdale Buses have gained a bit of a reputation for coming through Halton a couple of minutes early, something well worth being aware of if using their services, as it looks like it will be an ongoing issue. The good news is that if you have internet access you can now see the location of all buses that serve Halton in real time at www.bustimes. org/map. This works well smartphones as well as larger devices and is especially useful for deciding whether to head to High Road or Low Road for a bus.


CATON AND **BROOKHOUSE** FRIENDSHIP CLUB

HALTON GARDENING GROUP

Once again, a huge thank you to you all for your support for our Plant Sale in May. We took just over £1300 on the dav. which is а tremendous achievement. We couldn't do without the generosity of those who donate plants for the sale, and those of you who come along to buy plants for your gardens. Thank you all. As you know, all monies raised go towards planting projects throughout the village. We will soon be ordering spring bulbs for all the areas we garden.

A 'Heads Up' for 2025! We have decided we will combine the biennial Garden Safari and the annual plant sale next year. That means that you will be able to visit gardens in the village, and buy plants at the same time. We thought this would give you an opportunity to see plants you may wish to purchase in situ, and discuss positioning, soil type etc. with the person who has grown them. So mark the weekend of 7th/8th June 2025 in your diaries now!

We would like to invite you to open your garden for the Safari next year. You do not need to be an expert gardener, nor will you need to sell plants. We will provide you with all the necessary notices, maps and badges. We would like as wide a range of gardens open as possible throughout the village. We need a minimum of 12 to make it worthwhile for people to

come and look round, and the more the merrier. Please do consider this. We found last time that it was helpful to visitors to have a cluster of gardens in different positions around the village so that they could concentrate their visits, often over two days.

Community gardening this summer has been somewhat adversely affected by the weather. Somehow it seems to have rained most Tuesday afternoons. However, the structure of the planting in the Memorial Jubilee Garden and on the terrace at the Centre is holding up well, and the planters throughout the village now have their planting. The Parish Council will be removing two of the raised beds in the playground area at the Centre later this summer. The middle one will remain and has been planted up with herbs. The wildflower bank at the Centre continues to be a work in progress,

although there is much more colour in it recently. We have planted hundreds of plug plants in the bank, and we hope they become more established over the next year.

It's not all work with Halton Gardening Group! Along with friends and family members, the garden group visited RHS Bridgewater in early June. It was a rather chilly day for the time of year, but nevertheless the gardens provided colour and interest. One outstanding area was the meadow of candelabra primulas along the stream in the Chinese Garden. It is very noticeable that much work has been done to make it a resource for and of the local community. which is what differentiates it from other RHS gardens.
