CASTLE HILL OPENING

We are steadily making progress on preparing to open Castle Hill for public access in the spring. This includes fencing off the steeper banking and new gates. Hopefully a date can be announced for the official opening in the next edition of the Prattle.

ST WILFRID'S PARK REFURBISHMENT

A preferred supplier has been selected. The council is seeking to cover the estimated cost of £50,000 using a combination of council reserves and grants.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The council reviewed recent planning applications for St Wilfrid's Hall and Town End Farm field.

 St Wilfrid's Hall (24/01275/FUL). Erection of a two-storey detached building comprising of eight supported living apartments, part demolition and conversion of St Wilfrid's Hall into six apartments

- The council supports ways to bring St Wilfrid's Hall back into use. This application is the latest attempt to find a suitable use for the building and seems a reasonable approach. The council will support this application.
- Town End Farm field (24/01354/ OUT). Outline application for the development of 5 residential dwellings
- The council will object to this application due to the lack of detail. This site is within the Conservation Area and is adjacent to two listed buildings so any development should retain that character, e.g. stone clad. Also, the Neighbourhood draft highlights that the village needs homes of 1-3 bedrooms, not larger properties. It is not clear from this application whether these units these proposed meet requirements.

will be as good, so the Trust must average out amounts received when considering grants, but most certainly some compensation for terrible weather for various groups.

2025 then started with flooding early in the morning of New Year's Day and more glacial stone was eroded from the banking upstream, creating a threat to the footpath - and again depositing several tons in the Hydro inlet. Disappointing, but there will be a pile of these rather nice cobbles for use in

gardens, to collect by making contact with the undersigned, as they should be put to good use.

The focus is on keeping the hydro operational with a good maintenance team and "Duty Officers" who visit the hydro each day to take readings and to notify other members of the team should there be problems. We ran a series of DO training courses earlier in the year and thus have a good resource in this area at the moment.


River pollution unfortunately remains a problem, and we understand that the Environment Agency have diverted significant resource to it. Although the formal analysis has yet to be completed, our records show significant salmon and sea trout numbers traversing up our fish pass from early June to mid August 2024, being more than the same period in 2023.

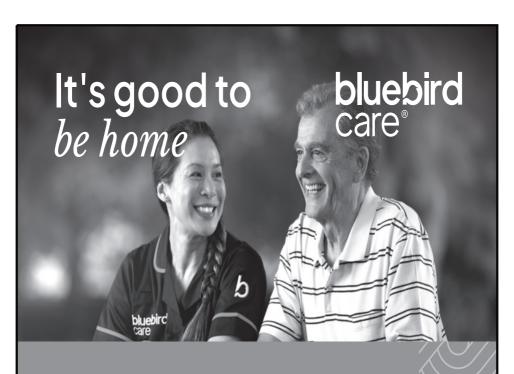

Many of you will know that I had a major bereavement in my life last September, when my husband Mike died suddenly when we were out walking up Warton crag.

In the months that have passed, I have spent a lot of time out on the shore at Hest Bank walking my dog, Archer. I find great solace in being out in the beauty of creation and especially being beside the sea. I find that my grief comes and goes very much like the tides and the waves on the shore. I would like to share with you a poem by Tessa Wilkinson which I have found very helpful.

The Sea and the Beach by Tessa Wilkinson

The sea seems to illustrate pain and sorrow so well.

It comes in and it goes out.

For a while it is there, overwhelming, covering everything

then slowly the tide turns and it withdraws.

For a while we can see the beauty of the shells, the seaweed

we can rejoice in the patterns in the sand

we can feel the corrugated ripples under our feet

alive to what is around, and beyond.

But then the tide turns and again it is all washed away,

all overwhelmed.

We feel like the crashing of the waves on rocks; raw and out of control, full of anger and rage, battered and bruised.

There are so many questions.

Why then? Why them? But no answers.

Then the sea calms and gently the waves lap the rocks

The pain is still there, but in control. We can recognise the pain, revisiting the sadness

I met an indigenous international fashion designer in Manaus whose work using traditional weaving and dyeing techniques has been seen worldwide: I met a Lancaster scientist based in a remote Amazonian study centre who measures the nutritional value of game caught by indigenous groups living nearby in the rainforest; I was lucky enough to meet Dom Phillips' widow Ale Sampaio, and heard about the institute she is setting up in Dom's name, as well as journalists and researchers working on indigenous issues in the rainforest.
