



VILLAGE NEWS

BURTON & RIGBY EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION, AUGHTON

(in the Parish of Halton with Aughton) The Trustees of the Burton & Rigby Educational Foundation will be meeting in September 2025 to consider applications for grants on behalf of pupils and students attending educational establishments other than primary schools.

Under the terms of the trust the trustees will consider applications from candidates who are boys or girls resident in the Parish of Halton with Aughton who, in the opinion of the trustees, are in need of assistance, and who will not have reached their nineteenth birthday by 1st September 2025. The trustees are keen to attract applications from all sections of the community and particularly from those families where any grant from the will make trustees the biggest difference. If applicants are eligible for the pupil premium grant it would be helpful if that is stated in the application.

Awards are made at the discretion of the trustees and in the allocation of benefits the trustees are required to have regard to the promotion of education in accordance with the principles of the Church of England. Applications, in the form of a letter,

should set out details of the school or other educational establishment attended and information available about the educational progress of the candidate. Letters should be sent to Mrs A Bowring, Clerk to the Trustees, & Rigby Foundation, Burton Hawkshead Farm. Halton Park. Lancaster LA2 6PD by Friday 5th September 2025.

Please note: Applications received after the closing date will not be considered. The letter of application should include the full name, age and date of birth of the pupil/student on behalf of whom application is being made.



Happy Summer Holidays!

School finished for the summer on 18th July, and children will return on 2nd September.

At the time of writing, we still have a few key events remaining: Sports Day, the production, and saying goodbye to a couple of staff members and our fantastic Year 6 children.

Looking back on my second year as headteacher, it is incredible to reflect on all the things that have happened. I am delighted that we were able to introduce our six core Christian values: Wisdom, Respect, Perseverance, Trust, Kindness, and Creativity. We have also built on our vision of "Love God, love each other, and love learning."



HOW TO APPLY BARK MULCH IN THE GARDEN

- · Choose the right type there are several types of bark mulch available:
- o Fine mulch: Suitable for vegetable patches and flower beds
- o Medium mulch: Ideal for borders and shrubs
- o Large bark chips: Perfect for decorative paths, tree bases and long-term coverage.
- · Ensure your mulch is well-composted or aged, as freshly chipped wood can temporarily draw nitrogen from the soil.
- · Prepare the area before mulching, it's important to:
- o Remove existing weeds: Mulch helps suppress new growth but won't kill what's already there.
- o Water the soil thoroughly: Mulch locks in moisture, so it should be applied to already damp ground


